FOOD FOR THOUGHT ON THIS WEEK'S READING (brought to us by Fr. John)

All our possessions, spiritual and material, are divine gifts to be shared because God is the first owner of all goods! This is the first order in creation with regard to our goods.

"When sought or accepted with a religious attitude, poverty opens one to recognizing and accepting the order of creation. In this perspective, the "rich man" is the one who places his trust in his possessions rather than in God, he is the man who makes himself strong by the works of his own hands and trusts only in his own strength. Poverty takes on the status of a moral value when it becomes an attitude of humble availability and openness to God, of trust in him. This attitude makes it possible for people to recognize the relativity of economic goods and to treat them as divine gifts to be administered and shared, because God is the first owner of all goods." (Compendium of the Social Teaching of the Church #324)

MANHOLE REPAIR PROJECT - REPORT OF MEETING OF PARISHIONERS - SEPTEMBER 21ST

THANK YOU to those who were able to stay for the general meeting of parishioners Sunday, Sept. 21st. The Wardens' Board really appreciates your support in these difficult decisions. For those who missed the meeting, this is the information you need to know.

- Parishioners authorized the Board to open a line of credit with Caisse Populaire Desjardins in order to retain the services of CS Terrec Inc. to repair our manhole problem. The company has been waiting for our reply for more than a month so the work should start soon.
- Concern was expressed that we had only one bidder. Five requests were sent out; three did not respond; one bid on only a portion of the work and did not follow up when this was pointed out to him. We simply do not know why the four others did not bid. The Diocese has authorized us to go ahead even though we had only one bidder. It was ascertained that CS Terrec had all the required credentials, and the bid is considered reasonable considering all the work to be done.

Of course, the main concern is how we will raise that much money. These are a few examples that were given:

- If 20 families or individuals give \$1,000; 10 give \$500; 10 give \$250; 40 give \$100; 50 give \$75. It is obvious that it will not suffice if we are all satisfied to give an extra \$5, but every little bit will be received with gratitude and added to the common pot.
- -Individual parishioners use their creativity to invent ways of fundraising in their own milieu of friends and colleagues: a meal where guests pay, a sale of crafts, a garage sale... We are trying to avoid that it be always the same people who are solicited to give.
- -Of course, the School Board was asked to help us pay. They are seriously considering the request but have not yet responded.
 - -We will request a donation from our MLA.
 - -We will send a letter to all registered parishioners.
- Two parishioners have each offered an interest-free loan of \$10,000 and, after the meeting, three others have joined to offer an interest-free loan of \$15,000. That means that we will not have to pay interest by borrowing from the bank. Of course, we still have to repay parishioners for these loans.
- It was stressed at the meeting that the donations for the manhole project must not reduce the regular Sunday collection which is essential to pay the regular bills.

We are sure and are thankful that everyone will collaborate according to their means.

WARDENS' BOARD

By Quebec provincial law, the Act Respecting Fabriques, a parish must have 6 wardens to administer the assets of the parish. In our parish each warden is assigned a particular task to oversee and report to the Board or consult with the Board for a decision. Normally, at the end of December each year, two wardens have completed their three-year term and can either be re-elected for a second three-year term or must be replaced after two consecutive terms. This year we will need to replace three wardens: Maintenance and Public Relations for three-year terms and Secretary to complete two years of a term. The titles give the responsibility of each. Broadly speaking, the Maintenance warden oversees all maintenance requirements for the church and rectory and grounds. Public Relations sees to all announcements and thanks and outside contacts. The Secretary warden takes the Minutes of the Board meetings. PLEASE, if you feel you could fulfill one of these services, contact the chair of the Board, Ann Marie Plante, Fr. John or any one of the present wardens. If you know of someone who could do this, try to convince him/her to step forward. What is really required is a profound love for this parish and a deep commitment to have it thrive. You can read more about the wardens' board at the following link:
